**A NOTED PIONEER
 PASSES AWAY SUDDENLY**

Samuel Striplin died suddenly
 at his home near the Escondido
 reservoir on the morning of the
 28th of July. Only a brief illness
 preceded his death.

Mr. Striplin was born in 1826 in
 Tennessee of Revolutionary par-
 ents. His ancestors fought under
 General Marion, the Swamp Fox.
 His grandfather was captured and
 brutally murdered by the Tories
 who chopped his body in two with
 a broad-ax.

Every one of the murderers paid
 the penalty with their lives. Dur-
 ing his early manhood Mr. Strip-
 lin immigrated with his par-
 ents to Illinois where he lived un-
 til the year of 1859, during which
 year he crossed the plains to Cal-
 ifornia and located in Sacramento
 valley. He was appointed captain
 of the train of immigrants and had
 some thrilling experiences with In-
 dians and at one time saved the
 train from being exterminated.
 About 300 rode into camp and be-
 gan their depredations. He cov-
 ered the leader with a gun and or-
 dered them to leave, which they
 decided to do. A large train was
 massacred a night or two after-
 ward on the same ground.

During his residence in Sacra-
 mento valley he was engaged in
 agricultural pursuits and also in
 freighting to the mines in the Si-
 erra-Nevada mountains. He lived
 there nine years, then came to
 San Diego county in the year
 1868 and located in old Bear Val-
 ley just above the present dam
 site.

There was very little agricul-
 ture carried on at that time, the
 inhabitants depending almost en-
 tirely on stock raising. They told
 him that nothing could be raised
 in this county of any consequence.
 He planted a crop of wheat and
 had nothing to harvest it with,
 when a company of thirteen In-
 dians applied for the job and be-
 gan to cut it with knives and
 sickles. He soon stopped that
 and got a cradle and cut it him-
 self. The next year he got a
 header and threshing machine and
 then became the pioneer of agri-
 cultural work in this section of
 the county.

He was active until the day of
 his death, which occurred sudden-
 ly on July 28th, 1911, and was
 caused by heart failure. He had
 been ailing for a few days but still
 continued to be active and on the
 morning in which his death oc-
 curred later insisted on returning
 to his work.

He leaves six children to mourn
 his loss.
